### LEGAL SERVICES POLICY ENVIRONMENT

Before joining ARTD Moya worked as both a paralegal and lawyer at Minter Ellison, a leading International Corporate Law firm, in the Media & Telecommunications team. Moya has a particular interest in the legal services policy environment and will commonly advise on the legislative landscapes and legal implications for evaluations and projects.

- » **Evaluation of Queensland Drug and Alcohol Court** (Queensland Department of Justice and Attorney-General, 2019) A quasi-experimental approach to understand which participants demonstrate outcomes across QDAC outcome domains, and the contexts and mechanisms perceived to drive or inhibit change.
- » **Evaluation of Southport Domestic and Family Violence Court** (Queensland Department of Justice and Attorney-General, 2019). 20-month evaluation through four overlapping phases, covering implementation, social and economic impacts and outcomes.
- » **NDIS Commission Evaluation and Performance Framework** (NDIS Commission, 2019-2020): In setting up the evaluation and performance framework for the NDIS Commission, understanding the legislative performance reporting requirements of the Commission as a Commonwealth regulator was a crucial part of this project.

### EVALUATION AND COMMUNICATION

Moya's strengths lie in qualitative data analysis and clearly and eloquently articulating findings. She is frequently involved in assembling and synthesising large volumes of qualitative data from a diverse range of stakeholders. Moya is a lead report writer at ARTD, and brings skills in the area of literature scans, document reviews, qualitative data collection and analysis.

- » **Rental reform—Queensland public consultation analysis** (Queensland Department of Housing and Public Works, 2018-19): Moya led the analysis and reporting of all qualitative data collected during the consultation. The dataset included over 130,000 responses—of which 2,800 were long form written responses. Moya was involved in the use of a machine-assisted analysis model for qualitative analysis and presented key findings. The report contributed to a cabinet submission and subsequent changes to the Housing Act.
- » **Reform of NSW Curriculum** (NSW Education Standards Authority, 2019): Moya coded most peak body submissions using NVivo software and prepared all summaries of peak body submissions. Moya led the qualitative analysis of the consultation responses, and was heavily involved in reporting of all data collected in the consultation.
- » **Australian Human Rights Commission Training Package** (2019): Moya was involved in developing training packages for the AHRC on the development of program logics and outcomes matrices.
