LEGAL SERVICES POLICY ENVIRONMENT

Before joining ARTD Moya worked as a paralegal and lawyer at Minter Ellison, a leading International Corporate Law firm, in the Media & Telecommunications team. Her law background is an asset when working on projects in the legal services policy space.

- » **NSW Drink and Drug Driving Reforms** (NSW Centre for Road Safety, 2020): Moya worked on the evaluation framework to guide the process and impact of implementing a suite of drink and drug driving reforms across NSW, and co-wrote the operational review of the reforms.
- » **Evaluation of Queensland Drug and Alcohol Court (QDAC)** (Queensland Department of Justice and Attorney-General (DJAG), 2020): This was a quasi-experimental approach to understand which participants demonstrate outcomes change. Moya advised on, and analysed many of the legal processes in the QDAC.
- » **Evaluation of Southport Domestic and Family Violence Court** (Queensland DJAG, 2020): Moya worked on the 20-month evaluation, which included implementation, social and economic impacts and outcomes of the Southport Court.
- » **NDIS Commission Evaluation and Performance Framework** (NDIS Commission, 2019-2020): In setting up the evaluation and performance framework for the NDIS Commission, Moya advised on the legislative performance reporting requirements of the Commission as a Commonwealth regulator.
- » **Rental reform—Queensland public consultation analysis** (Queensland Department of Housing and Public Works, 2018-19): Moya led the analysis and reporting of all qualitative data collected during the consultation, and was involved in the use of machine-assisted analysis. The report contributed to a cabinet submission and subsequent changes to the Housing Act.

EVALUATION AND COMMUNICATION

Moya's strengths lie in qualitative data analysis and clearly and eloquently articulating findings. She is a lead report writer at ARTD, and is particularly skilled in using the Nvivo software for data analysis. She also started managing smaller projects in 2020.

- » **NDIS Provider Sentiment and Satisfaction** (NDIA, 2018-2020): Moya has worked on this project for several years, and managed the project in 2020, conducting, qualitative analysis of information from NDIS providers on market segments.
- » **Educator Focus Groups** (National Evidence Institute, 2020): Moya co-wrote the final report for research with educators to understand their preferences for knowledge translation through online focus groups.
- » **Fair Work Commission National Wage Assessment Structure Trial** (Department of Social Services, 2020-21): Moya is currently working on this national project to evaluate a major trial of a new wage assessment structure for supported employees.
