Moya is an experienced project manager and designer of mixed-methods evaluations, and is a lead report writer at ARTD. She regularly collects and synthesises both qualitative and quantitative data using a variety of methods in her evaluations. She has experience working with people with lived experience on her projects in the suicide prevention sector, and has led the engagement with children and young people in several of the evaluations she has worked on.

Her recent evaluation projects include the Towards Zero Suicides Evaluation (evaluating six Toward Zero Suicides initiatives) (NSW Health, 2020-2023), the Child and Youth HOPE (aftercare service for children and young people at risk of suicide) (Victorian Department of Health, 2022-2024), NSW Suicide Prevention Framework Evaluation – Year 1 (Mental Health Commission, 2023), Older People's Suicide Prevention Pathway Evaluation (NSW Health, 2022-2023), the Fair Work Commission National Wage Assessment Structure Trial (Department of Social Services, 2020-21, and the Employ my Ability (Department of Social Services), 2022-2025.

Before joining ARTD, Moya worked as both a paralegal and lawyer at Minter Ellison, a leading International Corporate Law firm, in the Media & Telecommunications team. Her law background sees her commonly work on projects in the legal services policy environment. She also often reviews and advises on regulatory and legislative requirements or components of projects.
