- » Jobs Academy Expansion (Future Women, 2023-in progress): Project managing the process and outcomes evaluation of this program which aims to boost women's job readiness, workforce participation and economic security. Gathering evidence about the program's effectiveness, to inform decisions about ongoing funding.
- » Evaluation of the COVID Intensive Learning Support Program (NSW Department of Education, 2022-2023): Site visits to schools across NSW and online interviews, facilitating discussion among students, teachers and school leaders on their experience of the program. Coding and analysing this data using Nvivo software.

- » Review of Complaints Management Procedure; Alignment of regional operations support teams; Review of Serious Incident Response Team (Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (ACQSC), 2021-2022): Managed three separate, consecutive projects for ACQSC reviewing their processes, systems and teams, and refining these with supporting documentation and recommendations to create greater efficiencies to align with need and available resources.
