POLICY AND STRATEGY

- » **What is good evidence?** (OzChild, 2022-23): In his role as Project Officer, Tuli drafted a report commissioned by OzChild, an NGO with a suite of programs supporting vulnerable families and children, particularly those in out-of-home-care. For the 'What is Good Evidence?' report, Tuli synthesised insights drawn from a comprehensive literature review into an accessible guide on the epistemological basis of different types of evidence, how to evaluate evidence, and how to devise an evaluation strategy with the aid of implementation science tools.
- » **Co-design of a theory of change for a cross-sector integrated service initiative in a disadvantaged urban community** (2022-2023): In his role as Project Officer, Tuli contributed to the development of a co-designed Theory of Change, an evaluation framework, and other implementation tools on behalf of a service integration initiative comprised of a coalition of government and non-government agencies. The research component of this work included conducting a literature review, facilitating focus groups, and conducting qualitative data analyses.

RESERACH AND EVALUATION

- » **Co-design of an integrated intergenerational model** (Uniting, 2022-23): In his role as Project Officer, Tuli contributed to the development of a model of care for Uniting Westmead, where an aged care facility and early learning centre are co-located. This involved facilitating focus groups and a co-design workshop, conducting qualitative data analysis, and developing a theory of change and model of care.
- » **Building Resilient Communities** (James Martin Institute, 2023): In his role as Project Officer, Tuli conducted a comprehensive literature review investigating the role of social capital in community resilience, with a focus on Australian Government policies and vulnerable populations.
